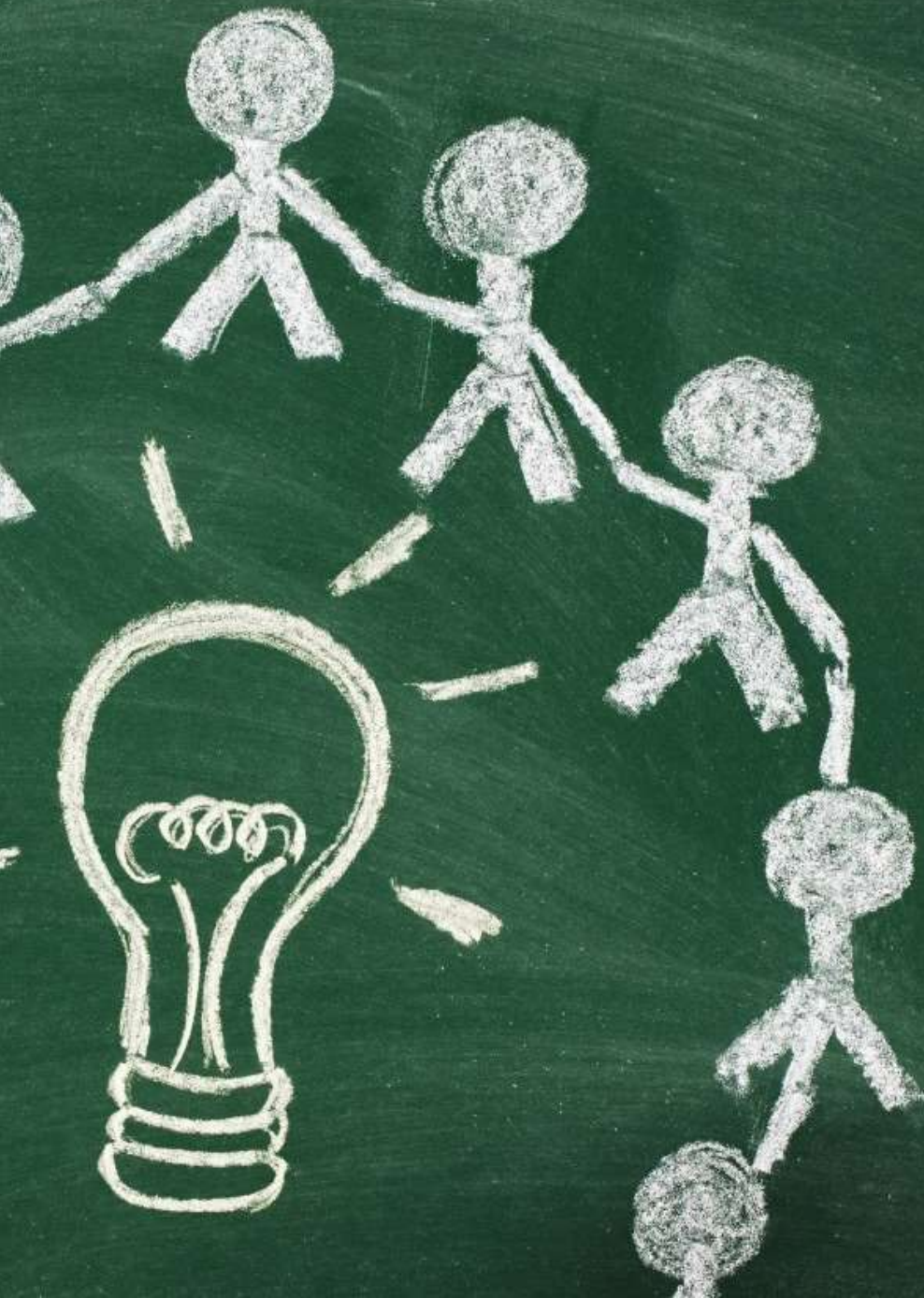

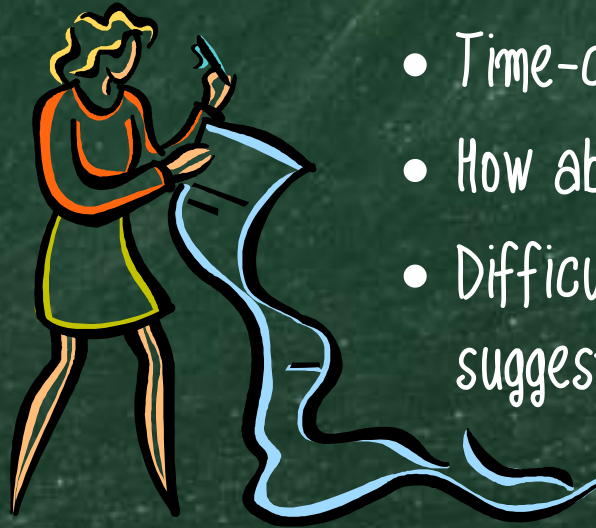
The art of visualizing ideas



The use of "List"



- Visual boring
- Can you find key words?
- Difficult to find important points
- Difficult to recall-remember
- Time-consuming
- How about focus & concentration
- Difficult to generate new ideas and suggestions



Mind Mapping — Some History

Diagrams that visually "map" information

Popularized by British popular psychology author and television personality Tony Buzan



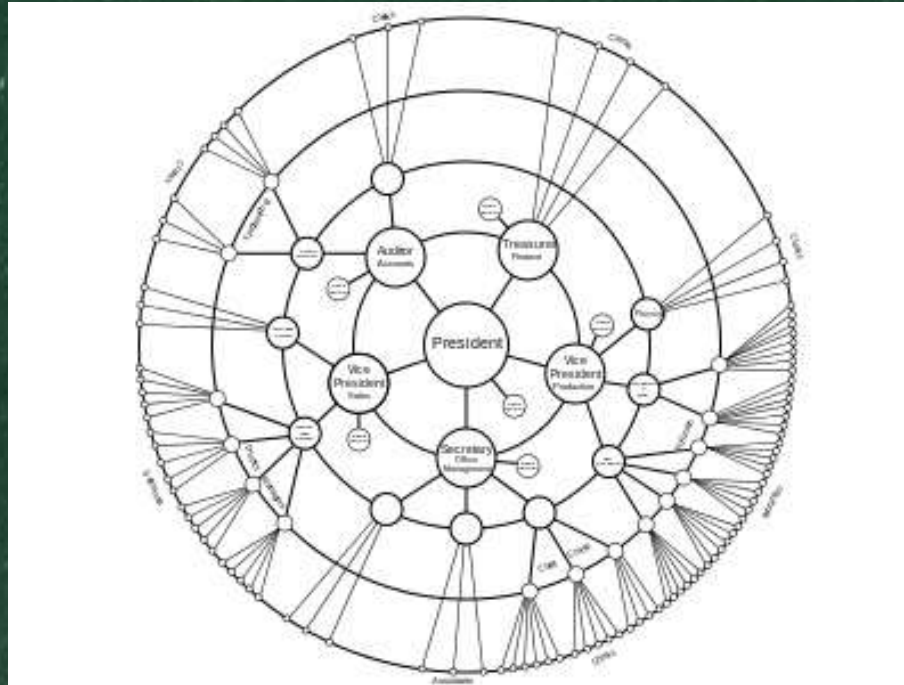
Mind Mapping – Some History

History in learning, brainstorming, memory, visual thinking, and problem solving

Earliest examples of such Graphical records were developed by Porphyry of Tyros (Lebanon), a noted thinker of the 3rd century, as he graphically visualized the concept categories of Aristotle



Mind Mapping — Some History



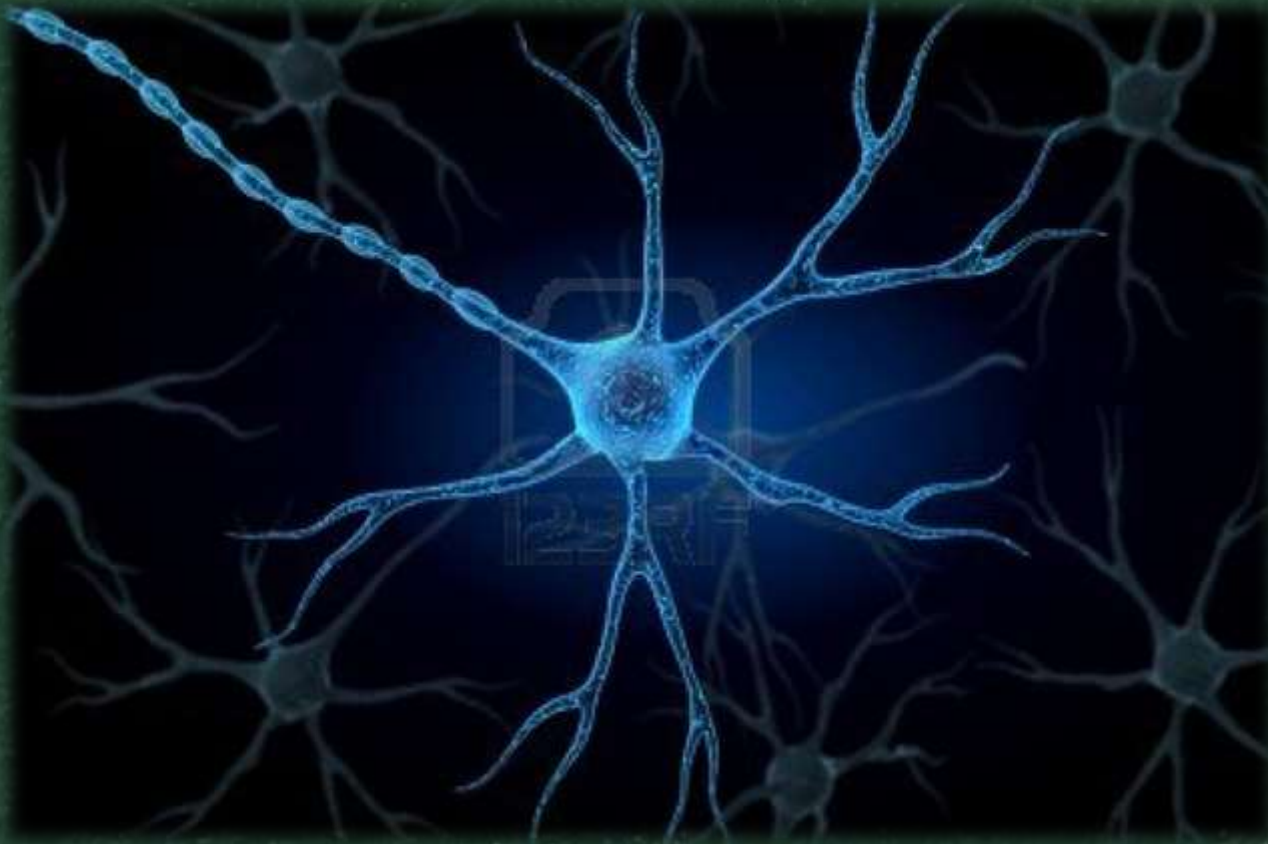
Radial tree

Method of displaying a tree structure in a way that expands outwards, radially

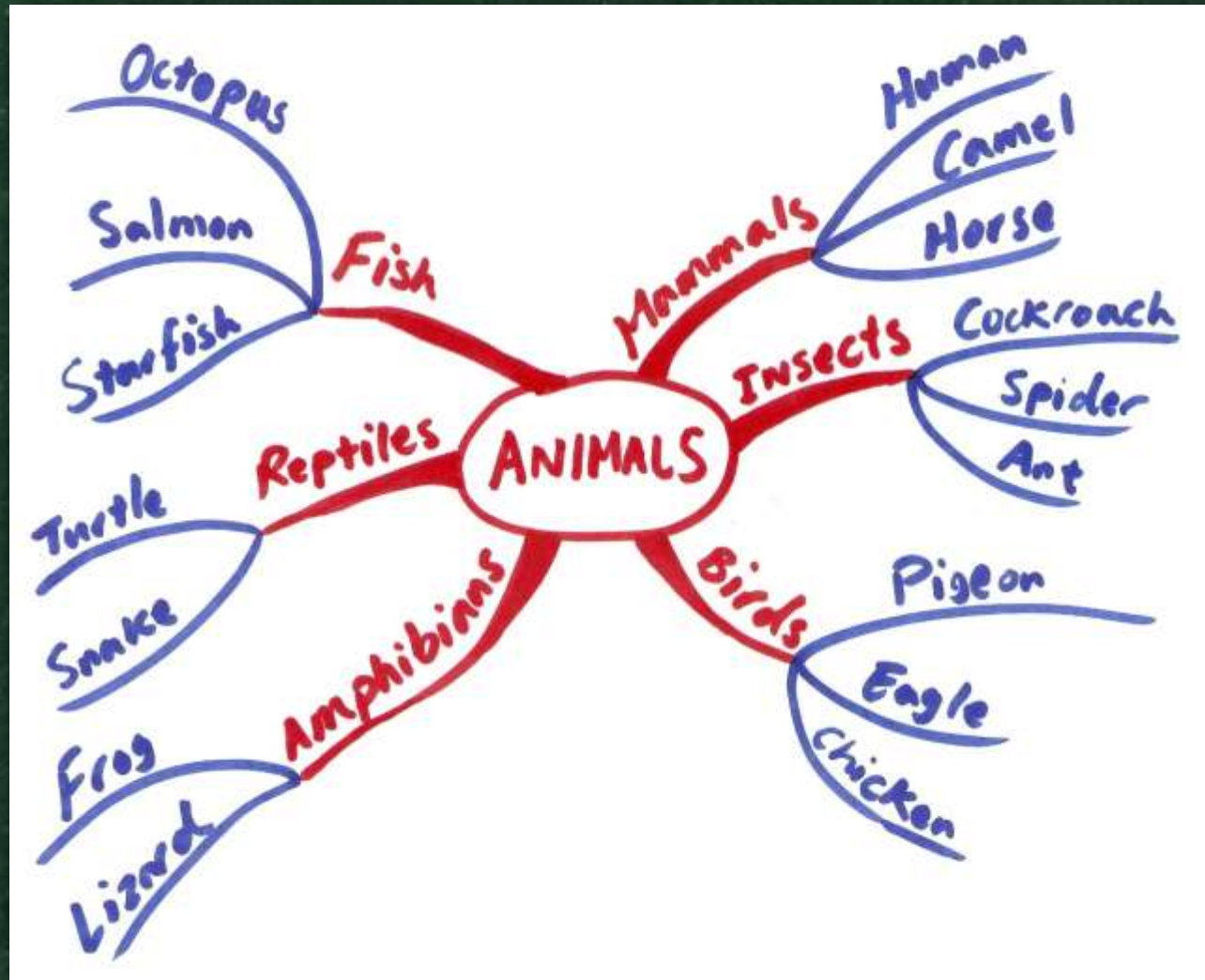

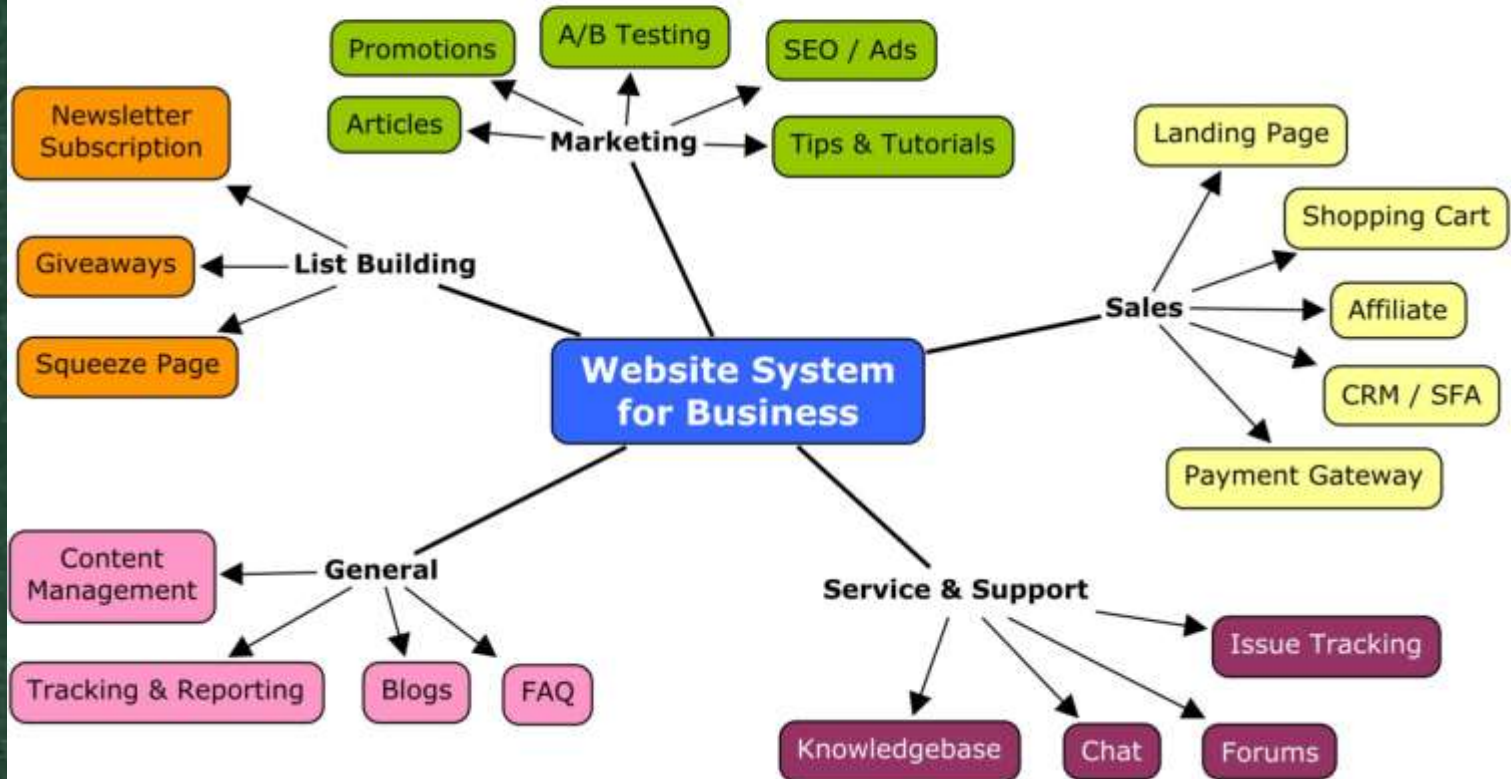

Breakdown of a Website System

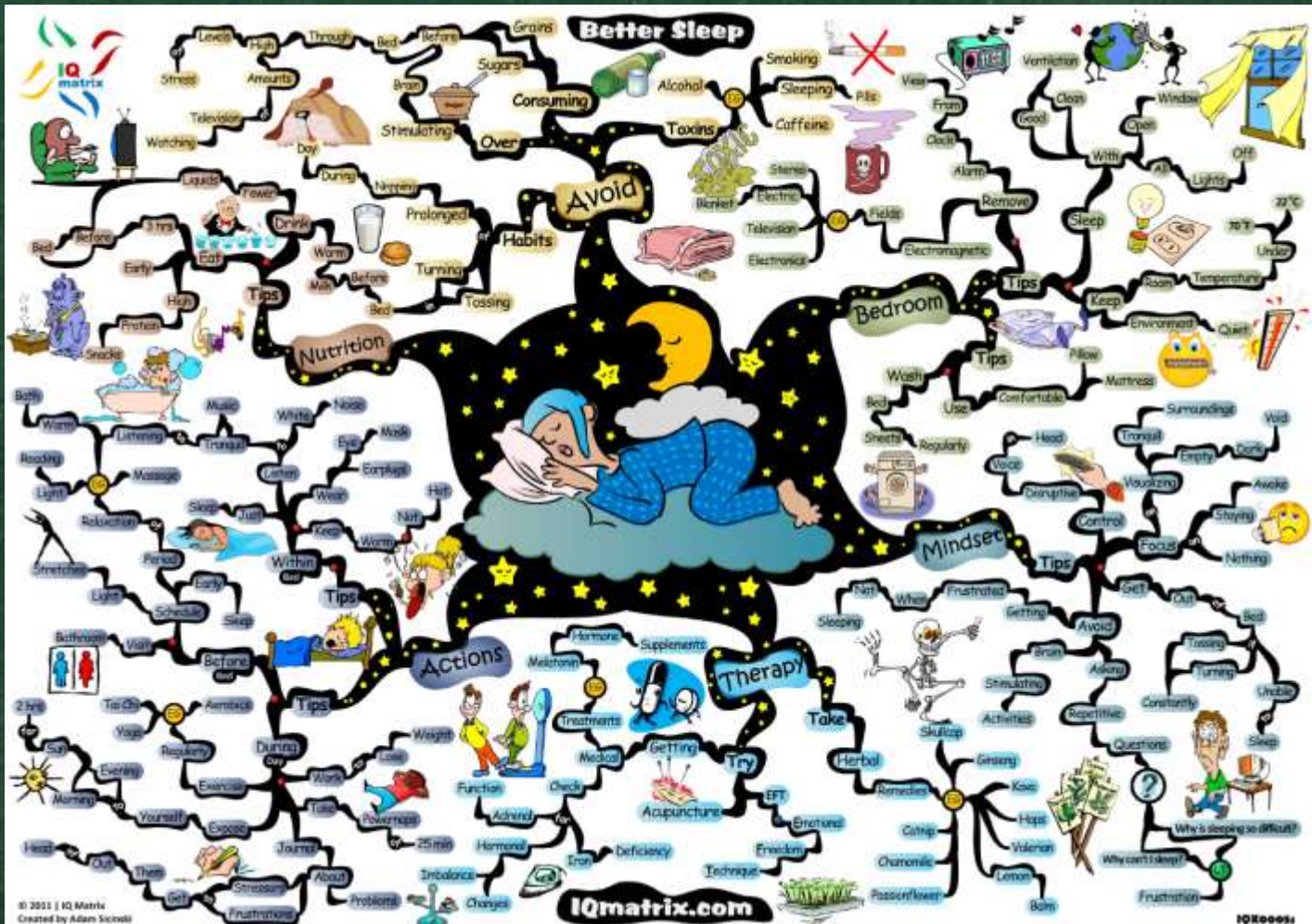

Tony Buzan's guidelines for Mindmapping

- Start in the center with an image of the topic
- Use images, symbols, codes
- Select key words
- Each word/image is alone on its own line
- The lines should be connected, starting from the central image
- The lines become thinner as they extend

Tony Buzan's guidelines for Mindmapping

- Make the lines the same length as the word/image they support.
- The Basic Ordering Ideas (BOI's) should be 7 ± 2
- Use multiple colors throughout the mind map, for visual stimulation and also for encoding or grouping

Tony Buzan's guidelines for Mindmapping

- Keep the mind map clear by using radial hierarchy
- Develop your own personal style of mind mapping

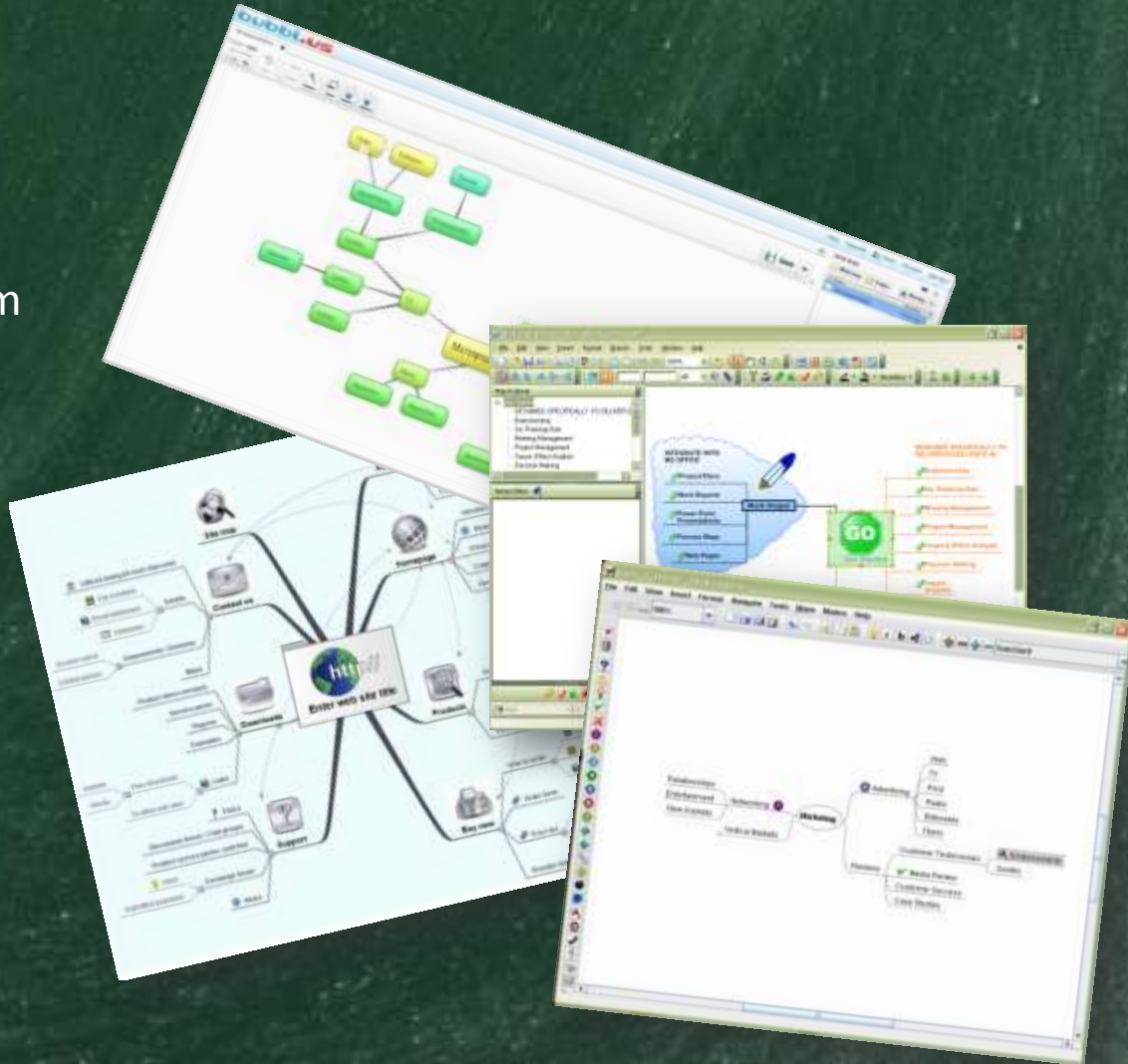
